Please read these instructions prior to your eyelid surgery:

- Bring a driver to your surgery. Your vision may be blurry after surgery and it may be difficult or unsafe to drive.
- If you are on aspirin or other blood thinners, tell your surgeon as soon as possible. The effects of some blood thinners can last for weeks after you stop them. They can affect your surgery. Some examples of blood thinners are:
 - Baby or other aspirin, warfarin (Coumadin), Eliquis, naproxen
 (Aleve), ibuprofen (Motrin), Xarelto, fish oil, clopidogrel (Plavix)
- Please fill your prescription for ointment prior to your surgery.
- Wear loose fitting, comfortable clothing to your procedure. Pants and a shirt are best.
- Do not wear makeup. Remove any residual mascara or eye makeup prior to the procedure.
- Shower prior to your procedure and thoroughly wash your face.
- After your surgery, you will have significant bruising of your eyelids and the tissues around them. This bruising will last at least two weeks.
- It may take a few weeks to get approval from your insurance company to perform the surgery. We will call you when we have their decision regarding prior authorization. If you do not hear from us within three weeks of your evaluation, please call for a status update.
- We will give you specific written instructions on what to do for post-operative care on the day of your surgery.
